

A Bill to Protect American Global Supremacy by Importing the World's Best Minds and Making Them American Citizens

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All international PhD, MD, JD, MBA, PsyD, ED, MA, MSW, BS, MAT,
3 BA, or MS students or students studying to attain the highest degree in his
4 or her field that is not an associate's degree or a certificate in the US will
5 be offered Permanent Resident Status and automatically be fast tracked to
6 American citizenship with their consent upon obtaining their PhD, MD,
7 JD, MBA, PsyD, ED, MA, MSW, BS, MAT, MS, BA, or the highest
8 possible non-associate or non-certificate degree in his or her field from
9 accredited schools. This law will affect no other areas of immigration.
10 Student visas will be given to any student who passes all security checks
11 and is accepted to an accredited school, as a result, all quotas on student
12 visas will be removed. This bill does not apply to illegal aliens due to
13 security concerns. Due to the education levels of the new Americans, no
14 sponsors will be required for the new immigrants as long as the
15 immigrants have worked out with their school a way to obtain
16 accommodations during their schooling. If a student on a student visa does
17 not obtain his or her degree in the maximum time allotted by his or her
18 school, that student will be asked to leave, but is allowed to come back to
19 the US provided that that person can obtain any type visa. Transferring to
20 new institutions is allowed but that student cannot take more time to
21 graduate than his or her original school allowed.

22 **SECTION 2.** International Student- a student who is on a student visa. PhD- Doctorate
23 in Philosophy. MD- Medical Doctor. JD- Juris Doctor. MBA- Master in
24 Business Administration. PsyD- Doctorate in Psychology. ED- Doctorate
25 in Education. MA- Master in the Arts. MSW- Master in Social Work. BS-
26 Bachelors in the Sciences. MS- Masters in the Sciences. MAT- Master in
27 the Art of Teaching. Highest non-associate or non-certificate degree in
28 their field- the degree in a field which one cannot get a degree that is more
29 advanced that is not an associate degree or certificate. Accredited school-
30 a school that has been deemed legitimate by the regional authority in the
31 school's region. Illegal aliens- non-American citizens who do not have
32 authorization to be in the US. BA- Bachelors in the Arts

33 **SECTION 3.** The government agency in charge will be the US Department of
34 Education, and the US Immigration and Naturalization Service.

35 **SECTION 4.** This bill is effective immediately.

36 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

RESOLUTION 702

A Resolution to Engage North Korea

WHEREAS, The United States and Europe continue to stand as the world leaders when it comes to fighting human rights abuses; and

RESOLVED, That the Student Congress here assembled make the following recommendation that the United States shall urge EU members to break diplomatic talks and trade with North Korea until such human rights abuses are ended; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the United States, in conjunction with the cooperating European countries, pledge to stop human rights abuses in North Korea.

RESOLUTION 703

A Resolution to Protect the Stubborn

WHEREAS, Current governmental policies prohibit the removal of citizens from their homes in the event of a disaster warranting MANDATORY evacuations; and

WHEREAS, During Hurricane Ike, 140,000 citizens ignored evacuation orders, culminating in some 1,984 rescues of citizens who chose to stay; and

WHEREAS, Wasted rescues take emergency crews time from helping the individuals who cannot evacuate or are in need of medical care; and

WHEREAS, Governments are put in a position where they cannot protect their citizens; and

WHEREAS, 48 citizens from mandatory evacuation zones died during Hurricane Ike, and

WHEREAS, Rescues place an unwelcome financial burden upon the taxpayers; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Student Congress here assembled make the following recommendation that both local and state governments will be given the power to remove citizens from their homes in the event of a disaster warranting MANDATORY evacuation; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That all necessary transportation and assistance will be provided for the individuals falling under said situation.

RESOLUTION 704

A Resolution Regarding Increase in Teacher Salary

1. Whereas, teachers prepare the future leaders of America, and
2. Whereas, public schools in the U.S. continue to suffer a severe shortage of
3. qualified teachers willing to teach under current pay, benefits, and working 4. conditions, and
5. Whereas, the American Federation of Teachers reports that average teacher pay lags
6. \$10,000 to \$15,000 behind average pay for jobs requiring comparable skills and
7. knowledge in the private sector, and
8. Whereas, state increase average teacher pay by 30% after inflation in order to
9. solve the teacher shortage, and
10. Whereas, roughly 20% of U.S. teachers have been assigned to teach in fields for
11. which they lack appropriate subject-matter training, according to .the State Board
12. for Educator Certification, and
13. Whereas, half of all new U.S. teachers leave within the first five years of
14. employment, often leaving for jobs that pay significantly better, therefore
15. BE IT RESOLVED that a tax increase be imposed in the U.S. to provide a 16.30% 16. increase in
teachers salaries and provide teachers with better benefits to better the 17. schools and our education
system.

RESOLUTION 705

A Resolution to Implement Internet Voting

WHEREAS, Voter turnout in the 2008 presidential election was only about 55% of those able to vote; and

WHEREAS, Traditional voting has been prone to coercion by party member as well as surrounding voters; and

WHEREAS, In this technological era, new coercion-resistant voting is possible; and

WHEREAS, Traditional voting is inefficient and prone to time-wasting recounts as was seen in Florida in the 2004 presidential election; and

WHEREAS, Internet voting would be more secure and less time-consuming than traditional voting; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Student Congress here assembled make the following recommendation that the United States will implement an internet voting option for future federal elections.

Bill 706

A Bill to Clean American Arteries

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Federal Government subsidizes any restaurants use of olive oil by
3 allowing restaurants to write 35% of the amount spent directly on olive oil
4 off on that restaurant's taxes.

5 **SECTION 2.** A restaurant will be defined as an establishment where meals are served to
6 customers .

7 **SECTION 3.** This bill will be enforced and executed by the United States Food and Drug
8 Administration. Funding will come from the Food and Drug
9 Administration. To receive the subsidy, restaurants will be required to
10 submit copies of receipts from the purchase of olive oil to the Food and
11 Drug Administration. Only receipts for purchases made after January 1,
12 2012 can be written off.

13 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2012..

14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill 707

A Bill to Implement a National Identification System

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. All citizens, permanent residents, and resident aliens of the United States will be required to hold national identification cards issued by the national government.

SECTION 2. The U.S. Government shall create a new department to oversee the proper use of the identification cards.

SECTION 3. The information contained on each card shall be stored in a computer chip that will include, but not be limited to, fingerprint information, medical data, credit card numbers, and a sample of DNA, along with the general data to be printed on the face of the card, such as name and date of birth.

SECTION 4. A DNA database shall be established within this department containing the DNA of all holders within the system, which shall be responsible for gathering the DNA and other information for the cards.

SECTION 5. The DNA identification system shall be used in conjunction with state and local authorities to aid in the crime-fighting process, and DNA evidence will be admissible and acceptable in court. The cards will also be used for online verification.

SECTION 6. All individuals must have the national identification cards in their possession at all times. Failure to do so will result in monetary fines.

SECTION 7. This bill will become effective January 1, 2014.

Resolution 708

A Resolution to Add New Permanent Members to the UN Security Council

WHEREAS, Major population centers such as India, Brazil, and South Africa are not currently represented; and

WHEREAS, Major economic centers such as Japan and Germany are not represented; and

WHEREAS, The addition of these influential nations to the United Nations Security Council will modernize the Security Council; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Student Congress here assembled make the following recommendation that the UN be asked to add India, Brazil, South Africa, Japan, and Germany to the UN Security Council as permanent members.
